



Outbreak Brief #127: Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Pandemic

Date of Issue: 21 June 2022

Global count: 545,656,563 cases and 6,315,804 deaths

Data sources: World Health Organization and African Union Member States

Outbreak Update: As of 20 June 2022, a total of 545,656,563 COVID-19 cases and 6,315,804 deaths (case fatality ratio [CFR]: 1.2%) have been reported globally by 232 countries and territories to the World Health Organization (WHO). The distribution of cumulative cases (percentage of global cases) from the WHO regions (excluding Africa) are as follows: Eastern Mediterranean Region 18,528,660 (3%), European Region 224,131,653 (41%), Region of the Americas 169,558,244 (31%), South-East Asia Region 58,356,239 (11%) and Western Pacific Region 62,892,484 (12%). In the last seven days, the five countries reporting the highest number of new cases are the United States of America (441,928), China (406,482), Germany (345,910), France (229,470) and Italy (225,785). As of 20 June 2022, over 4.7 billion people (59% of the global population) have been fully vaccinated. As of 6 p.m. East African Time (EAT) 20 June 2022, a total of 11,731,495 COVID-19 cases and 253,772 deaths (CFR: 2.2%) have been reported by the 55 African Union (AU) Member States (MS). This represents 2% of all cases and 4% of all deaths reported globally. Thirty-six (65%) AU MS are reporting CFRs higher than the global CFR. Since the detection of COVID-19 on the African continent (in February 2020), 53 (96%) AU MS have experienced three distinct COVID-19 waves, 47 (72%) MS have experienced four waves, 17 MS have experienced five waves, and two MS (Kenya and Mauritius) have experienced a sixth wave.

Fifty-three MS have reported COVID-19 cases infected with the Alpha (50 MS), Beta (45), Delta (50), Gamma (3) and Omicron (49) variants of concern (VOC). Additionally, 22 MS have detected the Omicron BA.2 sub-variant, while six MS detected the Omicron BA.4 and five MS detected the Omicron BA.5 sub-variants. Fifty-four (98%) MS are currently providing COVID-19 vaccination to the general population. Cumulatively, 592.4 million doses have been administered on the continent. Of these doses administered, 317.9 million people have been partially vaccinated, 248.4 million have been fully vaccinated, and 26 million have received a booster dose. Overall, 17.7% of the continental population is fully vaccinated. Eritrea is the only AU MS yet to start COVID-19 vaccination roll out. 


Figure 1: New COVID-19 cases reported in Africa by African Union region and epidemiological week, 15 February 2020 - 19 June 2022.

For Epi week 24 (13 - 19 June 2022), 32,120 new COVID-19 cases were reported, which is a 10% increase in the number of new cases reported compared to the previous week (23) (Figure 1). The Northern region accounted for 33% of the new COVID-19 cases reported this week, followed by the Southern (28%), Eastern (27%), Western (10%) and Central (2%) regions. Seychelles (313) had the highest number of new daily COVID-19 cases per 1 million population among all MS, followed by Cabo Verde (268) and Morocco (39).

Last week, 181 new COVID-19 deaths were reported in Africa, a 11% decrease in the number of new deaths reported compared to the previous week. Approximately 84% of these deaths were reported from the Southern region. The remaining deaths were reported from the Eastern (6%), Western (6%), Northern (3%), and Central (1%), regions. Cumulative COVID-19 case and death totals and new COVID-19 cases and deaths reported during week 24 by AU Member State are summarized in Table 1.

More than 350,000 tests were conducted during the past week, reflecting a 21% decrease in the number of tests compared to the previous week. The weekly % test positivity has increased from 7% to 9%, indicating that testing has decreased over the past week. New Africa CDC Response Activities

General:

- Dr. Ahmed E. Ogwell Ouma, Acting Director of Africa CDC, hosted the Africa CDC weekly press briefing on Thursday 16 June 2022 at 12 p.m. EAT. He provided an update on the COVID-19 situation across the continent, including response efforts and progress on increasing COVID-19 vaccination coverage. - 2. Africa CDC and the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) are holding the first virtual meeting of the COMESA Committee on health, from 20 - 21 June 2022, at 9 am EAT. The meeting aims to establish the committee on health, review the report on the operationalization of the COMESA Health Desk and provide an update on initiatives for local manufacturing of pharmaceuticals. Africa CDC in collaboration with the Mastercard Foundation are holding an Implementation Kick-Off Workshop for the Saving Lives and Livelihoods Programme partners from 21 22 June 2022 in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. The objective of the workshop is to discuss the engagement model with partners during the implementation phase, along with other relevant information required to kick-off full-scale implementation.

Surveillance:

- 1. Africa CDC in collaboration with the Robert Koch Institute, the International Institute for Infectious Diseases and the Southern Africa Development Community, held a three-day workshop on event-based surveillance (EBS) in Botswana for Southern Africa Member States, from 8 10 June 2022. The objectives of the workshop were to equip the EBS focal points with techniques of artificial intelligence (AI), tools and approaches of EBS and facilitate the establishment of an EBS community of practice with the southern Africa region
- Africa CDC and the Federal Ministry of Health, Nigeria are holding a stakeholder orientation workshop on mortality surveillance from 20 - 22 June 2022 in Abuja, Nigeria.

Recommendations for the Member States

- 1. AU Member States should continue to organize and implement COVID-19 vaccination campaigns, with a focus on increasing <u>eligibility</u>¹ and demand needed to achieve 70% vaccine coverage. Member States should also address vaccine misinformation with effective community-based risk communication and vaccine promotion activities.
- 2. AU Member States are encouraged to implement a tiered public health and social measures (PHSM) approach. This approach will ensure that measures are targeted and informed by the current COVID-19 situation.
- 3. AU Member States should continue to **enhance COVID-19² surveillance** efforts to include:
 - a. <u>Community-based surveillance</u>³ to detect symptomatic cases early and minimize viral transmission. Where feasible, <u>rapid antigen tests</u>⁴ and <u>self-testing</u>⁵ can be used to enhance diagnostic screening efforts.
 - b. Rapid mortality surveillance that focuses on collection, analysis and use of allcause mortality data captured from facility and/or community-based surveillance activities to improve knowledge of COVID-19 related outcomes.
 - c. <u>Genomic surveillance</u>⁷ to monitor the presence of variants and the spread and continuous evolution of the virus.
 - d. <u>Syndromic surveillance</u> for influenza-like illness (ILI) and severe acute respiratory infections (SARI)⁸ to monitor COVID-19 trends in comparison to other respiratory pathogens.
- 4. AU Member States are encouraged to:
 - a. Continue contact tracing activities where feasible based on the current epidemiological situation and country capacity.
 - b. Inform the general public about the importance of seeking immediate medical care for individuals who develop severe symptoms of COVID-19 (e.g. difficulty breathing).
 - c. Engage social scientists to help inform and enhance vaccination campaigns and PHSM implementation.
- 5. All AU Member States should notify and routinely share data with Africa CDC and WHO on confirmed COVID-19 cases, deaths, recoveries, tests conducted and infected healthcare workers to support data for action. Notify Africa CDC by emailing: AfricaCDCEBS@africa-union.org.
