Southern Africa Leaders Unite to Advance Bold Health Agenda for Resilience and Equity

At the 4th Regional Ministerial Steering Committee (ReSCO) meeting in Lilongwe, Dr Jean Kaseya joined health leaders from across Southern Africa to reaffirm a shared commitment to protecting the health and well-being of the region's people.

The discussions underscored the urgent need to strengthen cross-border disease surveillance, expand local manufacturing, invest in resilient

laboratory systems and accelerate digital innovation within primary healthcare.

Dr Kaseya emphasised that health security cannot be achieved in isolation. Solidarity and shared accountability remain the region's strongest defences. Africa CDC stands firmly with Member States to transform this unity into tangible action and lasting impact.

Empowering Malawi's Frontline Heroes



While still in Malawi, Dr Jean Kaseya closed a four-day training for 100 Community Health Workers (CHWs) from eight high-risk districts across the country.

These CHWs -from Lilongwe to Nsanje -are now equipped to detect diseases early, communicate risks and respond to outbreaks. They are the first line of defence in communities often beyond the reach of formal health systems.

This effort supports the African Union's Million CHWs Initiative -a bold call to expand access and strengthen health resilience. Dr Kaseya thanked Hon. Khumbize Chiponda, Malawi's Minister of Health, for her leadership and support.

He highlighted the renewed hope it brings to millions who have suffered from conflict and recurring disease outbreaks.

Dr Kaseya praised the mediators -particularly the State of Qatar and the US Government -for their instrumental role in advancing the peace process. He commended African Union Chair João Lourenço and the AU-appointed Mediator, Faure Gnassingbé, for their leadership. He also recognised Presidents Félix Tshisekedi and Paul Kagame for their strong commitment to peace and stability in the region.
