Ibanga: A Game-Changer in Ebola Response

A significant milestone in the fight against Ebola is unfolding in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Ibanga (MAB114), a promising monoclonal antibody treatment discovered by renowned Congolese scientist Prof Jean-Jacques Muyembe, is now being deployed with logistical support from Africa CDC.

With 100 doses already delivered to areas affected by the current outbreak, this life-saving innovation is offering new hope to patients and communities.

Africa CDC is supporting efforts to scale up production and distribution of Ibanga, recognising its potential not only to curb the latest outbreak but also to strengthen Africa's preparedness for future health emergencies. This collaboration highlights the potential of African-led innovation and the significance of continental solidarity in promoting public health.

Malaria's Return Demands Africa-Led Solutions



Malaria is resurging, and Africa is bearing the brunt. In 2023, the world recorded an estimated 263 million new cases and nearly 597,000 deaths — the vast majority in Africa. New outbreaks in parts of Southern Africa are compounding the crisis.

In a recent article in The British Medical Journal, Dr Jean Kaseya and Nebiyu Dereje lay out a critical roadmap: Africa must reclaim the fight against malaria by strengthening surveillance, advancing vaccine equity, scaling up prevention, and increasing domestic investment.

Africa CDC is urging swift action to reinforce surveillance and genomic research, ensure equitable access to vaccines, invest in proven prevention tools, and secure sustainable, locally led financing.

Ethiopia has reached a significant milestone by achieving World Health Organization (WHO) Maturity Level 3 for its medicines regulatory system.

This designation places Ethiopia among a select group of African nations recognised for having a stable, well-functioning, and integrated regulatory authority capable of ensuring the safety, quality and efficacy of medical products.

In response to the news, Dr Jean Kaseya, stated: "Ethiopia's progress reflects a strong commitment to building resilient health systems. Trusted and capable regulators are essential for Africa's health security and for accelerating local pharmaceutical manufacturing across the continent."


Weekly real-time insights on public health threats across the continent

Survey Shows High Mpox Vaccine Support, But Challenges Remain



A new Africa CDC study conducted between December 2024 and August 2025 across nine African Union member states shows strong public engagement in Africa's fight against mpox.

significant gaps remain. Knowledge of symptoms remains low in some countries, misinformation continues to circulate, and stigma persists as a barrier to care. Closing these gaps is crucial to protecting communities and sustaining progress.
