

Africa CDC Deploys Emergency Support After Attack on Sudan Hospital

Africa CDC is dispatching emergency medical supplies to Sudan following the 28 October attack on the Saudi Maternity Hospital in El Fasher, North Darfur, which killed hundreds, led to the abduction of health workers and crippled one of the region's few remaining hospitals.

Working with the African Union Humanitarian Affairs Division, Africa CDC has also deployed experts to support outbreak control, sustain essential care, and reinforce biosafety in the

affected area. The agency is coordinating with Sudan's Ministry of Health and the World Health Organization to assess the health impact.

Africa CDC urged all parties to protect health facilities, staff and laboratories to prevent further biosecurity risks. With Sudan already battling multiple outbreaks, continued attacks on health infrastructure are deepening the crisis.


Weekly real-time insights on public health threats across the continent

Bavarian Nordic Donates 110,000 Mpox Vaccine Doses to Africa



An additional 110,000 doses of mpox vaccines have been donated by Bavarian Nordic to boost Africa's response to the ongoing outbreak. The vaccines have been allocated to Uganda - one of the most affected countries in 2025 - through the Mpox Access and Allocation Mechanism (AAM), coordinated by Africa CDC and global health partners to ensure equitable access. The donation will strengthen Uganda's response and enhance the continent's ability to manage current and future outbreaks. Africa CDC noted that continued collaboration with partners like Bavarian Nordic is vital to

building a prepared, self-reliant, and resilient Africa.

With this contribution, Bavarian Nordic's total mpox vaccine donations to Africa now stand at 165,000 doses. Africa CDC Director-General Dr Jean Kaseya said the partnership reflects a shared commitment to equitable access and collective health security, adding that only through sustained cooperation can Africa build the systems needed to prevent and respond to future public health emergencies.
