AU Ministers Unite Behind Major Push to Strengthen Africa's Health Workforce

African Union health and finance ministers, together with Heads of Delegations, have called for urgent and sustained investment in Africa's health workforce to strengthen health security and advance universal health coverage. The appeal was made at a High-Level Side Event during the 39th AU Assembly, co organised with Africa CDC and the AU Commission.

Leaders highlighted the essential role of community health workers and strong immunisation systems, warning that Africa's severe workforce shortage threatens outbreak detection and basic health services. Despite

that more than one million CHWs are now deployed, coverage remains well below global benchmarks, and most programmes still lack stable domestic financing.

The meeting underscored the strong economic returns of investing in health workers and urged countries to prioritise workforce financing, protect frontline spending and use AU accountability tools. Leaders concluded by endorsing a declaration committing to accelerated investment in Africa's health workforce.

New Commitment Advances Local Manufacturing for Africa's Health Security

In a major step to strengthen Africa's health sovereignty, leaders committed to increasing the local production of essential health products. They endorsed a target for Africa to manufacture at least 60 per cent of its health products locally by 2040 and supported full operationalisation of the African Pooled Procurement Mechanism to improve access, affordability, and reliability across the continent.

Dr Jean Kaseya recognised the leadership of H.E. William Ruto, the African Union Champion on Local Manufacturing, noting that his sustained advocacy has kept local production

at the forefront of the continental agenda. The upcoming 2026 Extraordinary Summit on Local Manufacturing in Nairobi is expected to build on this momentum and turn political commitment into concrete progress.

Africa CDC reaffirmed its commitment to this shared vision, emphasising its role in driving implementation, strengthening partnerships and supporting countries in scaling up manufacturing capacity and long-term health security across Africa.

AFRICA'S HEALTH SECURITY AND SOVEREIGNTY AGENDA

Africa's Health Security and Sovereignty (AHSS) agenda builds on the New Public Health Order adopted in 2022 after COVID-19. It addresses reduced aid, recurring outbreaks and fragile supply chains. Centred on five pillars - governance, preparedness, financing, digital innovation and local manufacturing - AHSS seeks to strengthen resilience and cut external dependence. By 2040, Africa aims to produce 60% of essential health products, secure its data and lead in global health.

Africa CDC and UNFPA Unite to Improve Sexual and Reproductive Health Across Africa

A new partnership between Africa CDC and UNFPA aims to strengthen women and adolescents' health across Africa by expanding access to sexual and reproductive health services, enhancing data-driven decision-making, and scaling innovative health solutions. Signed during the 2026 African Union Summit, the agreement establishes a framework for deeper collaboration to expand access to sexual and reproductive health and rights and to strengthen resilient, equitable health systems.

The partnership includes joint efforts to boost local manufacturing, pool procurement of sexual and reproductive health, maternal, newborn and adolescent health products, and advance digital health systems, while strengthening the capacity of health leaders and programme managers. It also underscores both organisations' commitment to African led innovation, sustainable financing and coordinated policymaking in adolescent, maternal and reproductive health.

Dr Kaseya joined Africa's Ministers of Foreign Affairs at the opening of the 48th Ordinary Session of the African Union Executive Council, held ahead of the 39th AU Assembly in Addis Ababa.

Strengthening Primary Health Care Key to Saving Mothers' Lives



At a high level forum hosted by the Susan Thompson Buffett Foundation, Dr Kaseya participated in the launch of a new initiative focused on maternal health and sexual and reproductive health and rights. The forum highlighted the urgent and preventable reality that nearly 20 women in Africa die every hour from childbirth.

Dr Kaseya emphasised that Africa's Health Security and Sovereignty (AHSS) agenda

must focus on interventions proven to save lives. He underscored the need for stronger primary health care systems, a well-supported health workforce - including community health workers - reliable access to essential maternal health commodities, and improved data systems to drive accountability and measurable results.
